

Cemil Aydin [caydin@gmu.edu] studied at Boğaziçi University, İstanbul University, and the University of Tokyo before receiving his Ph.D (2002) from Harvard University, Cambridge, MA. He was an academy scholar at the Harvard Academy for International and Area Studies, and a post-doctoral fellow at Princeton University. He is currently associate professor of history at George Mason University, VA. He previously taught at Harvard College, Princeton University, Ohio State University and the University of North Carolina-Charlotte. Prof. Aydin published extensively on international history of the Muslim world and Asia, Orientalism, and global intellectual history. His recent publications include a book on the *Politics of Anti-Westernism in Asia: Visions of World Order in Pan-Islamic and Pan-Asian Thought* (Columbia University Press, 2007), a co-edited volume on “Critiques of the West in Iran, Turkey and Japan” in *Comparative Studies of South Asia, Africa and the Middle East* 26:3 (Fall 2006). Prof. Aydin is currently working on a book project on the intellectual history of the idea of the *Muslim World* (forthcoming, Harvard University Press).
