

Corri Zoli [cbzoli@maxwell.syr.edu] is an assistant research professor at the Institute for National Security and Counterterrorism (INSCT), a joint graduate research center at the College of Law and the Maxwell School of Citizenship and Public Affairs at Syracuse University, NY. Dr. Zoli's research focuses on contemporary problems of warfare from an interdisciplinary law and policy perspective, social scientific approaches to changing patterns of global conflict, and the role of the laws of war (or international humanitarian law) in contemporary conflict dynamics. In addition to problems of conflict norms and security, her research interests include the role of technology, culture, and religion in contemporary security dynamics and in post-conflict transition. This includes issues that range from U.S. veterans post-service experiences to research on the changing nature of the U.S. military force structure. Dr. Zoli teaches a seminar entitled, "Law and War," at Maxwell and prioritizes interdisciplinary research with various partners in and beyond Syracuse University, including: the Institute for Veterans & Military Families (IVMF), United States Institute of Peace (USIP), New America Foundation (NAF), Brookings, International Institute of Higher Studies in Criminal Sciences (ISISC), among others. Zoli's research has been published in *Foreign Policy*, *Harvard National Security Journal*, the *Fletcher Forum of World Affairs*, among other venues.
