

Edip Yuksel [19@19.org] is an American-Turkish-Kurdish author and activist. He spent over four years in Turkish prisons in the 1980's for his political writings/activities that promoted an Islamic revolution in Turkey. While a popular Islamist youth leader, Dr. Yuksel adopted the Qur'an alone philosophy after corresponding with Rashad Khalifa and reading his landmark book, *Qur'an, Hadith and Islam* which led to major changes in his life in 1986. He parted ways from his comrades, including Tayyip Erdoğan and Ahmed Davudoğlu, who have been leading Turkish politics for over a decade. As a consequence, he was declared to be a heretic, an apostate deserving death. In 1989, he immigrated to the US under the sponsorship of Rashad Khalifa where they worked together at Masjid Tucson until his mentor's assassination in 1990. Edip Yuksel is the author of over twenty books and hundreds of articles on religion, politics, philosophy and law in Turkish and English. His English books include *Qur'an: a Reformist Translation, Manifesto for Islamic Reform, Peacemaker's Guide to Warmongers, Nineteen: God's Signature in Nature and Scripture*. Dr. Yuksel organizes international conferences for Critical Thinkers for Islamic Reform (Emory Law, Oxford University, Los Angeles, Almaty, Istanbul) and is the co-editor of the annual anthology carrying the same name. After receiving his B.A. from the University of Arizona in philosophy and Near Eastern studies, he earned his law degree from the same university. In addition to his work as an activist, writer and lecturer, Dr. Yuksel works as an adjunct professor of philosophy at Pima Community College, AZ. He is fluent in Turkish, English and Classical Arabic; proficient in Persian, and barely conversant in Kurdish, his mother tongue. To promote rational monotheism and peace, Dr. Yuksel founded Islamic Reform and co-founded Muslims for Peace/Justice/Progress (MPJP).
