Dr. Sinanović has been at the Naval Academy since 2006. His research interests include transnational Islamic revival, Southeast Asian politics, Islamic movements, Middle East politics, Islamic political thought, and Islam and politics in general. At the Naval Academy, Dr. Sinanović teaches courses on Southeast Asian politics, Middle East politics, and Islam and politics. He speaks Bosnian, English, Arabic, and Malay. He resides in Edgewater, MD, with his wife and two daughters.
