He is the program leader of the Religion and Law (*Shari'ah*) project within the Institute. Dr. Roose is currently working on projects examining *Shari'ah* and legal pluralism among Muslim communities in the global cities of Sydney, Australia, New York and more broadly in Jakarta, Indonesia. His broader research focus examines Islam in Western contexts, *Shari'ah* in secular legal systems, citizenship, multiculturalism and political and religious violence and radicalism. He is also working on a project examining the decline of the automotive and manufacturing industries in Melbourne and Detroit with Bryan S. Turner. Dr. Roose is the current executive officer of the Australian Association for the Study of Religion and a co-convenor of the "Ethnicity, Migration and Multiculturalism" thematic group at the Australian Sociological Association. He was a visiting scholar at the City University of New York (2013) and visiting academic at New York University (2013). Beginning July 2014, he will be a visiting scholar at the East Asian Legal Studies Program at Harvard University.
