

Maliha Chishti [maliha.chishti@gmail.com] teaches at both Ryerson University, Toronto, and Wilfrid Laurier University, Waterloo, Canada. She is currently a Ph.D candidate at the University of Toronto researching the politics of pluralism and ownership in post-war reconstruction, with a focus on Afghanistan. She is the former director of the Hague Appeal for Peace, United Nations office where she coordinated the Global Campaign for Peace Education, and developed the first peace and disarmament education pilot project for the United Nations Department for Disarmament Affairs in four war-affected countries. While in New York, Ms Chishti helped to initiate the historic Security Council Resolution 1325 on Women, Peace and Security. She has worked as an anti-AIDS education prevention officer in Malawi (Central Africa), and most recently a gender consultant on CIDA's proposed Arghandab-Irrigation Project in Kandahar, Afghanistan. She also conceptualized and supervised a national post-conflict capacity-building training program for over 90 Afghan women organizations across Afghanistan. Ms. Chishti has given numerous public lectures and panel presentations, and has been featured in the documentary *Beyond the Frame* alongside Noam Chomsky, Vandana Shiva and other scholar-activists. She also served as a member of the Board of Directors of the Association of Muslim Social Scientists of North America (2003 – 2007). Ms. Chishti has been afforded the distinct honor as a “Great Minds Alumni” by the University of Toronto.
