Mohammed Rustom obtained his Ph.D. (Islamic philosophy and Quranic studies) from the University of Toronto's Department of Near and Middle Eastern Civilizations in 2009, and is currently associate professor of Islamic studies at Carleton University, Ottawa, Canada. An internationally recognized expert on Sufism, Islamic philosophy, and Quranic hermeneutics, his works have been translated into Albanian, French, German, Persian, Spanish, and Turkish. Professor Rustom is the author of the award-winning book *The Triumph of Mercy: Philosophy and Scripture in Mulla Sadra* (SUNY, 2012), co-editor of *The Study Quran: A New Translation and Commentary* (HarperOne, 2015), translator of Abu Hamid al-Ghazali's *The Condemnation of Pride and Self-Admiration* (Islamic Texts Society, 2018), and author of *Inrushes of the Spirit: The Mystical Theology of 'Ayn al-Qudat* (SUNY, forthcoming). Professor Rustom was the recipient of the Ibn Arabi Society Latina's 2016 Tarjuman Prize for contributions to scholarship on Ibn 'Arabi, and for the 2018-2019 year will serve as Library of Arabic Literature Senior Fellow at the New York University Abu Dhabi Institute.
